Property Crime Specialist Jason Salyards has been with the Oklahoma City Police Department for almost 13 years. PCS Salyards started his career with OCPD as a dispatcher. After two years, he was accepted into the Property Crimes Unit. His primary role is investigating and documenting various property crime scenes where forensic evidence is potentially present. He was also previously assigned to the Crime Scene Unit as a Crime Scene Investigator. He currently volunteers with the OCPD Wellness Unit. PCS Salyards has an associate degree in Police Science from Oklahoma State University.

In 2005, he was a member of Kenyon Emergency Services anddeployed to New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina. He served as a Team Leader collecting the remains of deceased individuals primarily from the Lower 9th Ward and St. Bernard's Parrish.

He was previously employed as a Police Officer with the Dyersburg City Police Department in Tennessee from 1994-2001. During his time with the department he was a Field Training Officer and member of the Special Response (Tactical) Team. PCS Salyards is a Veteran of the United States Army and was deployed to Iraq during Desert Storm as an Armor Crewman on the M1A1 Abrams Main Battle Tank.

He is married to his wife, Joy. They enjoy spending time together, taking trips, and cheering for their beloved Boston Red Sox.

ABOUT THE PRESENTER:

Rockie Yardley was employed for 39 years at the Edmond Oklahoma Police Dept. as a Technical Investigator, Bomb Disposal Technician, and Dive Team Instructor. He retired in 2019.

Rockie instructed for the U.S. State Department's Anti-Terrorism Assistance Program where he taught Bomb Disposal, Post-Blast Investigation, and Target Vulnerability to foreign national law enforcement personnel.

He is the developer and Chief-Instructor for the Underwater Explosive Recovery Specialist Course. This program taught Law Enforcement and Military Personnel, who were already Scuba Divers and Bomb Disposal Technicians, how to safely recover or render safe underwater explosives or IED's.

Rockie was one of two Technical Investigators for the Edmond Post Office Massacre on Aug. 20th, 1986, where an employee killed 14 fellow employees, then himself.

Prior to joining the Edmond PD in 1980, he was a Paramedic Supervisor for EMSA in OKC.

During the 1995 Oklahoma City Bombing aftermath, he arrived within minutes at the site and spent every day during the duration of investigation assisting the FBI and ATF in victim and evidence recovery. After the implosion of the building, he was selected to be part of a hand-picked small group of investigators and specialists to recover the last three victims.
